## Curriculum Intent Together, we are Included, Involved and Inspired

At All Saints' CE Primary School, our curriculum has Inclusion at its heart. We are fortunate to have a diverse and rich community which is drawn from many countries and between us, our families speak a large number of languages and represent a wide variety of world and religious views. We are culturally and linguistically rich however, mastery of vocabulary in English can be a challenge for many of our pupils. We therefore set a high priority on enriching language through teaching language progression and the understanding of vocabulary through articulation. Our children need to understand the important historical, technological and cultural events which have shaped Britain as it is today so that they know their place in the world and together we can move forwards understanding who we are collectively and what has influenced our society as it is today.



We want our children to flourish and live life in all its fullness to be involved and active citizens; fully playing their part in society and enriching society with their gifts- with this in mind, children will learn **creativity** and sporting skills as well as academic disciplines to encourage and enthuse them to be life long active and creative individuals. The curriculum is organised so that children collect knowledge gems that they can collect and recall.

We will deliberately ensure that children will study people which represent minorities at the time and yet have achieved prominence in their field e.g. Marie Curie, Diocletian (son of a slave to Roman Emperor) Louis Braille (blind inventor of Braille) Rosa Parks (civil rights activist).
