This year we are thinking about the HOPE we can find in the Easter story. These challenges throughout LENT help us to think HOPE for ourselves, our family and the world we live in.

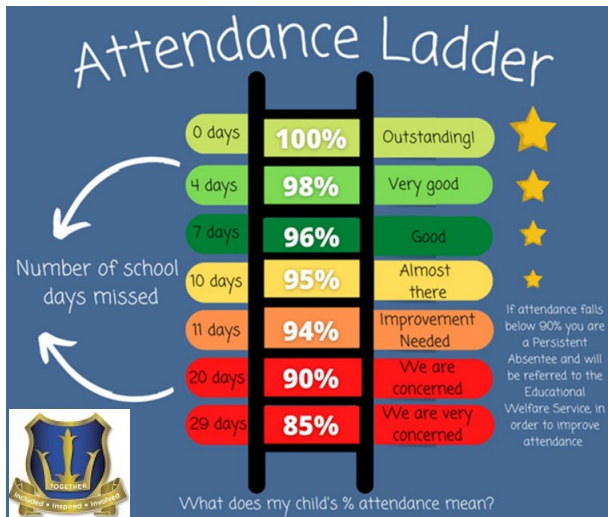
CHALLENGE No. 1
