School Sports Premium spend 2023-2024

At **All Saints' C E Primary School** we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with the potential to change young people's lives for the better.

Sport Premium Grant

This year, All Saints' School was given a grant of £17,610.

To benefit the children at All Saints', we have spent the funds as follows where spending which will result in sustainable impact, the initiative will be highlighted in green:

- 1. Lunchtime and After School clubs run by coaches- £5628. We have provided a range of clubs this year, from gymnastics, tag rugby, football, hockey, cheerleading, multisports, dance, athletics, cricket, netball and mindfulness and movement, providing children with a wide range of skills, fun and access to competitions. This prepared the children for upcoming competitions throughout the year. It also gave pupils the opportunity to try new sports, build confidence, keep fit and have fun
- 2. Membership and package from the Forest Heath Sports Association £2755. This gave the school access to a range of high-quality coaches, staff professional development, clubs and festivals. This enabled us to further increase pupils' participation in a wide range of high- quality PE lessons, extra-curricular clubs and competitive matches and festivals. We have attended more competitions and festivals than ever before giving over 150 opportunities for children to take part in events. We also ran cross country, dance and skipping events in school which every child in the school had opportunity to take part in. Playmaker training was included to train our year 5s over 6 weeks in leading play at break and lunch. The Forest Heath package also included CPD training for staff members (PE conference networking meeting, Tennis coaching, PE teacher training for ECT, Teacher training on TOP Sportsability). It also included a six-week block of learning for Reception pupils on Balanceability bikes. This encouraged our youngest children to become confident on balance bikes and graduate to pedalbikes as they can to keep active. We had a netball, hockey and cricket coach to enable staff to learn alongside to enhance their skills and confidence.
- 3. Bikeability £540 We provided training for all Year 5 children to learn to ride bikes safely on the roads. This encouraged them to use their bikes safely and in the future will help them to keep active with a healthy lifestyle.
- 4. Overtime for staff for sports competitions and festivals was paid using Sport premium -£776 this ensures we are safe with our ratios when taking children out of school for competitions. The festivals are a way of our children experiencing new sports,

places, other competitors and competition and improves confidence, sportsmanship and adds purpose to practise undertaken in school culminating in an event.

Miscellaneous:

Pony Academy £1500

All Year 6 children attended Pony Academy at the British Racing school. This improved confidence, taught them how to ride and look after a horse. It also enabled balance, core muscle strength, stamina and improved fitness as well as being enjoyable.

- 5. PE equipment £190—This will ensure that the children have good quality equipment to use at playtimes and lunchtimes which helps encourage active pupils during their breaks.
- 6. Subsidising sports activities at year 6 Residential £286
- 7. Make tyre area all weather by using bark and fencing £2,000
- 8. Woodland learning area £2000
- 9. Sport and playground equipment £1,450

Total spend to date - £12,159

Remaining - £5,451 will be spent on items identified in Orange by September 2024.

To be spent in the summer term on staff overtime, sports day medals and stickers, transport costs-business insurance for staff driving to fixtures next year, arena floor brushing. We also plan to buy sports and playground equipment in preparation for next year.
