

Impact of Sports Premium 2023-2024

As a result of PE spending in 2023-2024:

Items highlighted in green show sustainability.

- The school still has its PE Gold Mark. This means at All Saints', we are continuing to provide many opportunities for children to develop in Sport and Physical Education.
- 2250 hours of after school sports classes were made available to children in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 – covering hockey, athletics, multi-sports, cheerleading, archery, gymnastics, tag rugby, fencing, cricket, football and dance.
- Staff lead netball, cheerleading, football, yoga and movement, cricket, gymnastics and cricket coaching which was made available to KS1 and KS2 children to ready them for competitions during the year.
- Increased participation in active activities during lunch times and play times using the new PE equipment has enabled children's enjoyment in physical activity.
New equipment purchased will be used for many years to come.
- Participation in competitions has continued and increased this year with 504 opportunities for children to represent the school in 20 competitions and team events. We entered the swimming gala and KS1 gymnastics for the first time in a number of years. Year on Year, the skills in these pupils who compete improve and develop over the years, creating sustainability in enthusiasm and participation.
- Playmaker training sessions were made available to the current Year 5 children as part of their PE lessons in September/October 2023. They learned how to play playground games, and then to teach and lead playground games. For the rest of the year, they have each used these skills to teach games to the younger children in KS1 and lower KS2. This creates sustainability for years to come as these children sometimes become Sports Leaders at their senior schools, in part because of their leadership encounters with the Playmakers.
- Provision of expert sport teaching has been good with outstanding elements. Our sports coaches have been helping support teachers in developing cricket, netball and hockey. This has been hugely successful as the children love it, the teachers also gain confidence and new ways to teach. It is a terrific way to upskill the teachers and a great use of the PE budget as their experience will help them next academic year to teach the sport independently.
- We have no more room left for PE equipment! Our cupboards are bursting with wonderful equipment for both the top and bottom playgrounds, the teachers' PE outdoor store shed and the hall cupboard too. This will help PE continue to be a big part of the school. Pupils use the equipment daily and have been encouraged to take

ownership and help tidy the equipment away after each session. This will help look after the equipment for the future.

- We have used some of the money from the PE budget this year to encourage Physical development of pupils with SEND, with the purchase of a disco light box for dancing inside, soft play equipment for our special needs room and some fine motor skills activities to help with dexterity and fine finger movement. We feel this will benefit those children who use the Rainbow room to use their bodies in a variety of ways and to develop both fine and gross motor skills for the future.
- Owing to allowing pupils to lock bikes at the front of school as well as the bike sheds we have seen an increase in the amount of children cycling to school.
- Every week Year 4 and 5 walk to and from the swimming pool in all weathers which is just over a mile away and enables improved fitness and stamina as well as road safety awareness. The children measure the time it takes them at the start of the year compared to the end and note how they are quicker and fitter.
